CROSSING THE FINISH LINE

Summary

God has said in His Word that Jesus Christ is coming back for His beloved saints. Since we do not know the day, we should be living our lives so others see Christ in us. Let us participate in those things that bring honor to God. Our promise is not one of God's wrath upon us, but the hope of Christ's appearing and giving us changed bodies.

Gospel Presentation

One great and wonderful gift we can receive from God is salvation. The believer in Christ will not see the day of His mighty wrath because He has provided a way for us to be delivered from it. God sent His beloved Son, Jesus Christ, to die for us. His shed blood forgives the sins of every believer—paying a debt we could never pay ourselves. Every time we sin, His blood has already forgiven it! But we must personally believe His blood saves us from our sins. Just as Christ was raised from the dead, we too can know that we will be raised to new life one day. We will be given new bodies when He comes to take us out of this world to live with Him.

Application

Many times when we open our birthday gifts, we share them with our friends or family. If others see us living for Christ, by how we act and treat others, we usually get the opportunity to share the gift of Christ's salvation with them. It's almost like a secret. They want to know what makes us different from other friends. If they

believe in Christ, we, like Paul, have the opportunity to tell them about a wonderful event coming soon...the glorious Rapture!

Encouragement

Don't be discouraged if the wait for His coming at the Rapture seems too long. God is using that time to make you holy as He is holy. He uses the difficult times in our lives to make us more like Christ so we can be witnesses for Him on earth while He is in Heaven. Remember what your hope is and keep looking for that day to come. God's Word is always true.

Introduction - Anticipation

As your birthday draws near, what do you think about? Looking and waiting for that special day! Does your mind keep drifting, thinking about how the event will be celebrated? **Knowing** your birthday will come soon enough, are you on your best behavior eagerly **waiting**? God's Word tells us about a day far more exciting than our birthday; a day all believers should anticipate. On that day, the Lord Jesus Christ will appear in an event in which all believers will be gathered together.

Paul taught the young believers of Thessalonica (which is in mondern day Greece), many truths about God's plan of salvation, including a special event known as the Rapture.


What Is the Rapture?

The Rapture is simply a Bible truth that explains how the age in which Christians now live will come to a close. God had known about this truth since before the world began, but He kept it a secret, not sharing it with anyone until he told the Apostle Paul. Paul tells the saints that the Lord Jesus Christ is coming back for those who have placed their faith in Him! We don't actually find the word "rapture" in the Bible. Rather, we find the phrase "caught up." The Latin root word for "caught up" is "raptor." Interestingly enough, raptors are descriptive of a specific kind of bird, such as a hawk or an eagle. These birds are known to seize their prey so quickly that they are generally unaware of what has happened to them. Swiftly, the prey are carried away. Similarly, when Jesus Christ comes for us at the Rapture; He will swiftly, but lovingly, call us into the air at the sound of the trumpet, change our earthly bodies into new glorious bodies that are in the likeness of Himself, and we will live forever with the Lord. So, the doctrine of the Rapture is our Blessed Hope in which we **know** Jesus Christ will come back for us.

1 Corinthians 15:51-52—"Behold, I shew you a mystery; we shall not all sleep, but we all shall be changed, In a moment, in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trump: for the trumpet shall sound, and the dead shall be raised incorruptible, and we shall be changed."

Questions Arise From Doubt

There was confusion among the saints as certain people had been distorting God's Word concerning the truth of the Rapture. Their intent was to plant seeds of doubt about Christ's return. The believers became worried about those beloved saints who had already died. If they died before Christ had come for them, would they miss out on the joy of the Rapture as promised by God? So, Paul addresses their concern.



Initially, those who have died will come back with the Lord in their soul and spirit, and He will raise their old bodies that are still in the grave and give them new bodies just like Christ's! *Then*, we who are still alive at His return, will also be caught up and have our bodies changed in the twinkling of an eye. That is faster than a blink! Those who have died will not miss out on the Rapture.

Wouldn't it be exciting to witness an event like Haley's Comet streaking across the night sky? It appears once in a lifetime, every 76 years. What if you planned to watch it only to discover you missed its appearance? Another cause for the saints to lose heart and begin to doubt was that some people had said the Rapture had already come. As a result, they feared they had missed Christ.

2 Thessalonians 2:1-3, parenthesis added—"Now, we beseech you, brethren, by the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ, and *by* our gathering together unto him, That ye be not soon shaken in mind, or be troubled, neither by spirit, nor by word, nor by letter as from us, as that the day of Christ is at hand (present...imminent). Let no man deceive you by any means: for *that day shall not come*, except there come a falling away first, and that man of sin be revealed, the son of perdition."

The 'Day of Christ' is referring to Christ's second coming and should not be confused with His coming for the saints at the Rapture. When Christ comes during the Rapture *in the air*, this event will occur in the twinkling of an eye, so fast that no one left on earth will either have seen Him or our departure. But years later, Christ will return again to establish His kingdom *on earth* for a thousand years. At this second coming of Christ "every eye shall see Him" (Rev 1:7). It is the time when God will bring about His wrath upon those people who rejected Jesus as Lord and Savior. Therefore, Christ will come first for the Rapture of the saints in love, while His second coming later will begin in wrath. Paul had already spoken to the believers about these things, but apparently they needed reassurance.

Paul calms their hearts and minds by explaining that the 'Day of Christ' had not come as yet. Two things must occur before the day of God's wrath upon man. First, the 'falling away' that Paul mentions must take place. This 'falling away' means 'the departure' and is a direct reference to the Rapture. Second, the son of perdition will be revealed, the Antichrist. Thus, the day of God's wrath had not begun! Furthermore, God gives the body of Christ a wonderful promise in his Word that He "hath not appointed us to wrath, but to obtain salvation by the Lord Jesus Christ." (1 Thessalonians 5:9).

We must remember we are Christ's ambassadors while here on earth. Just like a United States ambassador who is appointed to live in a foreign country to represent our government, we also are appointed by God to represent His Son, the Lord Jesus Christ. If our government were prepared to declare war on a particular foreign land, it would first remove our ambassadors as a means of safety. So too, Christ will remove His ambassadors from earth before He brings judgment against the world who rejected Him.


Waiting and Looking for Him

Paul expected the Rapture to occur at any time. He thought it would take place while he was still alive! He and all the saints were looking forward to their gathering unto Christ and having their bodies changed to a glorious body. It has been 2000 years since Paul wrote these letters. Should we still be looking for Him? Of course! While we are hopefully waiting, we should live godly lives for Him. Others should see the love of Christ demonstrated in our lives. We should be having our minds centered in Christ, looking for His return. The enemy, Satan, would like for us to concentrate on worldly things such as something we may want to buy, or being angry with someone we know. However, God would desire that we read his Word, memorize Scripture, and pray, to keep our focus on Christ while we wait for Him.

Colossians 3:1-4— "If ye then be risen with Christ, seek those things which are above, where Christ sitteth on the right hand of God. Set your affection on things above, not on things on the earth. For ye are dead, and your life is hid with Christ in God. When Christ, *who is* our life, shall appear, then shall ye appear also with him in glory."

HIDING GOD'S WORD IN YOUR HEART



To help you memorize your verse - let's put it on something that will last, for those who may have not have trusted Christ as their Savior to see. Use self hardening modeling Clay - make it flat so it looks like a tablet. It should be about 1/4" to 3/8" thick. Use a sharp item that won't break in the clay (such as a sharpened 1/4" dowel or pencil) to write your verse in the clay. Let it sit to harden.


